Voluntary return counselling

What is it?

Individual, demand-oriented and anonymous counselling for people who are thinking about or already decided to return voluntarily to the country of origin or another country and/or who are legally obligated to return.

If you are:

- a foreigner without any right of residency (e.g. "Duldung", negative asylum)
- an asylum seeker with no answer from BAMF yet
- foreigner with residency

Voluntary return counselling tries to provide all the information that you need to decide well informed and autonomous:

- Clarification of your legal status and possible prospects of returning home
- Information about the situation in the country of return
- Referral to other institutions and aid organizations in Germany and the country of return

How can we help?

What does the voluntary return counselling offers people who want to return:

- Developing together a personal plan of returning back home
- General guidance on organising departure
- Assistance by organising all the necessary documents
- build opportunities which ease the reintegration in your country of origin
- Get in contact with other counselling offices that support your stay back home
- Information about funding for voluntary return

Reasons for a voluntary return back home are different and always personal:

a lack of perspective, no residency status, unsre legal stay, wrong imagination, home sickness, worries about the family back home...

If you decide to return back home the counselling office can provide help in how to manage and organise a sustainable and future-oriented return in dignity and security and can be helpful in the reintegration process.

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
